BOISE COUNTY -- Make-A-Wish® Idaho is hosting the 22nd annual Gebert-Arbaugh Polar Bear Challenge on Jan 11 at Spring Shores Marina at 11 a.m. with day-of registration beginning at 10 a.m. The Gebert Arbaugh Polar Bear Challenge, presented this year by Corwin Ford, is a unique winter fundraiser where participants plunge into the icy water to help grant life-affirming wishes to Idaho children who have been diagnosed with critical illnesses.

Individuals or teams of participants raise pledge money by promising to dive into the freezing water in support of wishes. There is no minimum donation required to plunge. Participants are encouraged to donate an amount that is personally meaningful to them and those who raise more than \$100 will receive a Polar Bear Challenge t-shirt. All proceeds from the fundraiser will go to-

ward Idaho wishes. The event is estimated to draw hundreds of participants and Make-A-Wish Idaho's fundraising goal for the 2025 event is \$100,000. To sign up online, visit Idaho. wish.org.



BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

December 31, 2024

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan, and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance CONSTITUENT INPUT:

A constituent inquired regarding property tax billing for a commercial property that was still being developed.

MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from 12/17 and 12/20/2024. The motion carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE ANNUAL STREET REPORT: Clerk Mary Prisco explained the report and Lindstrom motioned to approve the Road and Street Report for FY2024. The motion carried.

ANNUAL CONTRACT WITH THE ATLANTA HIGHWAY DISTRICT:

There is a contract that had not yet been signed by the AHD board. However, AHD has submitted an invoice with a 15% increase that has not been budgeted for by Boise County. AHD said that they would not do any snow removal until this invoice has been paid. Lindstrom said, "The predicament is that...we are responsible." Prosecutor Sosa suggested the issue be discussed in executive session.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chairman Tucker motioned to go into executive session for pending litigation. [Time 9:16 am to 9:39 am] Coming back into session, Chairman Tucker asked if there was any other discussion on the Atlanta Highway District and Commissioner Callahan answered, "Nope."

ELECTRIC CHAIN-SAWS: The Road Department is requesting electric chainsaws for each of the graders, because there have been so many trees down over the road with the heavy snowfall. The request will include between five and six chainsaws. Lindstrom said he thought it was a good idea, if they can find the money

Lindstrom motioned for the Road Department to purchase three electric chainsaws. The motion carried.

A returning part-time employee for Garden Valley was discussed as a seasonal worker. A motion was made to hire the seasonal employee and the motion carried.

ANNUAL PUBLIC DE-FENSE REPORT: Clerk Mary Prisco explained the expenditures and Lindstrom motioned to approve the annual Public Defense Expenditure Report for fiscal year 2024.

SNOWMOBILE CLUB: There was a representative from the Idaho City side that spoke regarding the grading trail and an area of concern.

TAX CANCELATION: Several motions were said for tax cancelations.

SHERIFF'S VEHICLE: Sheriff Scott Turner said that there was a patrol vehicle that was totaled about a month ago and the insurance was going to cover \$34,923 for a replacement vehicle. They will need to purchase it and wait for the Ford F150 to be built in 6-8 months. The department does have one vehicle to spare. Three new vehicles are also being built as part of the rotation of Sheriff's vehicles. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the Sheriff's request to purchase a replacement vehicle. The motion carried.

BASIN SCHOOL SRO **AGREEMENT**: The school agreement was discussed with the county prosecutor. Alex Sosa reminded the board that this was a service that the Sheriff's Office was not required to provide. He added that Sheriff Turner goes "above and beyond" to rotate officers to find the right people to put in there. Lindstrom motioned to approve the Sheriff's SRO [School Resource Officer] agreement for the Basin School District. The motion carried.

ROAD MATERIALS FOR **BOISE COUNTY**: Amounts for contracts and contractor quotes were discussed. This was a rate for gravel for additional damage done to roads during the increased recreation use of the COVID-19 period, and to recoup COVID-19 money given to the county through the federal government. Lindstrom had done the research with these long-time providers of gravel and motioned to approve the amount of \$74,500, \$74,500, and \$35,033. The motion carried.

SLFRF PROJECT: COV-ID-19 funds and their potential uses were discussed, including the road materials, culvert replacement, and HVAC for the East Boise County Ambulance building.

AGRICULTURAL PROTECTION AREAS: A resident of Horseshoe Bend said that when this law was passed, he was "kind of excited about it" and the compensation. However, he shared some concerns.

An ordinance was provided by the Idaho Association of Counties, and was considered by the board. Lindstrom motioned to approve Boise County Ordinance 2025-01, a zoning ordinance for Agricultural Protection Areas. The motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chairman Tucker motioned to go into executive session to discuss pending litigation. [Time: 10:45 am to 11:04 am] No action was required.

PLACERVILLE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS: Interviews were held for fire protection district commissioners.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve a payroll addition for a part time position. The motion carried.

Director Mari Adams reported that Unit 14 and 15 were both out of service. "Unit 15 has an exhaust leak that went into the cab and also into the box. Thank goodness it was after they had transported a patient." It should still be under warranty. The heater module for the box caught on fire and deemed the other ambulance unsafe. This one should also be under warranty from Ford. The extent of the damage underneath is still in question.

Chairman Tucker asked if there was an update on the new ambulance order. Adams said there was no response to an email, but production should have started in January.

SOLID WASTE: There were some difficulties with the Idaho City dump site due to the lack of snow plowing.

EMERGENCY MANAG-ER: The mass gathering permit with Boise County has not been completed for the Polar Bear Plunge.

PROSECUTOR: Alex Sosa said that in the last week of 2024, they filed 70 felony cases. He added, "The judge made a comment that we probably set a record for the number of arrest warrants."

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Tucker motioned to go into closed session to discuss risk management. [12:24 pm to 12:40 pm] Coming back into session, Tucker said they were going to continue their discussion on the SLFRF project. Commissioner Lindstrom read that the board had determined the community needs that have amassed since COVID and account-

ing for budget requests each vear: "The harm was felt from COVID itself, but it also imposed government shutdowns. The following allocations are targeted responses related in reasonable proportional to the significant and prolonged harm when considering the population of Boise County. The physical size of Boise County, the rural nature of Boise County, the increased poverty rates of Boise County, and the influx of out-of-county individuals that stayed or spent time travelling through Boise County. The allocated amount is considered related and reasonably

proportioned when considering the individual departments total budgets since the beginning of COVID and beyond today." Lindstrom then motioned to allocate the SLFRF funds to the Road and Bridge Department, culvert replacement, radios, and EBCAD's new HVAC system and salaries, phone systems, public health, and Sheriff's Office with a total of \$1,521,080. The motion carried.





Proposed Gold Mining Operation in Boise National Forest



Boise National Forest Releases Final Record of Decision for the Stibnite Gold **Project**

BOISE COUNTY — The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service released the Final Record of Decision for the Stibnite Gold Project Jan. 3, 2025 after Payette National Forest Supervisor Matthew Davis and Boise National Forest Supervisor Brant Petersen signed the final decision. The Stibnite Gold Project is a proposed mining operation in central Idaho on the Payette and Boise National Forests that would create one of the larg-

est gold, silver, and antimony mines in the United States.

The Final Environmental Impact Statement and Draft Record of Decision were released Sept. 6, 2024. Immediately following the release, a 45day objection period and subsequent objection resolution period occurred. The objection resolution period culminated in a set of changes that strengthen the final decision. On Dec. 18, 2024, objection responses were issued by the deputy regional forester.

The Final Record of Decision outlines the Forest Service's decision to authorize a mining operation as proposed by Perpetua Resources, LLC in their 2021 Modified Mine Plan and to approve a special use authorization for transmission line upgrades and installation of a new power transmission line with supporting infrastructure. Additionally, the decision approves project-specific plan amendments to the 2003 Payette National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan and the 2010 Boise National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan as amended.


"The signing of this decision represents the culmination of over seven years of scientific study and analysis. Through collaboration with interested

parties and partnership with our cooperating agencies, the record of decision incorporates input from a broad spectrum of backgrounds and perspectives," said Forest Supervisor Matthew Davis. "I am grateful for the input the Payette National Forest has received in the development of the environmental impact statement and am confident that the decision signed today is better for



City Council Meeting in IC

IDAHO CITY -- The City Council in Idaho City held their regular meeting on Monday, December 30th, 2024. Those present or joining via Zoom included: Mayor Kenny Everhart, Council Members Ashley Elliott, Mari Adams, Tom Secor, and Ryan Heffington. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

MINUTES: The December 11th minutes were reviewed. Council Member Secor motioned to accept the minutes from December 11th, 2024, and the motion carried.

BILLS PAYABLE: Mayor Everhart explained that these were the bills from December 12th through December 30th, 2024. Secor motioned to pay the bills in the amount of \$60,462.93. There was no discussion and the motion carried.

LETTER OF INTENT: A letter was received from a candidate for Idaho City's Parks and Recreation. The mayor would like to pass the letter along to that board.

HISTORIC PRESEN-**TATION COMMISSION**: Rhonda Jameson explained that she had written a grant, but there were some issues for them to commit the funds.

EMPLOYEE UPDATES: Everhart said that Public Works has been plowing a lot of snow.

LAW ENFORCEMENT: Chief Brent Watson said it was a big day for the Idaho City Police Department, and thanked the council, fellow officers, family and friends for being present. He said that they received six applicants, and that after testing, a background check and more, Jake Nye was the top choice of all the applicants. Chief Watson said, "Jake brings a good amount of experience with dispatch – for being here in town, a local residence here. He's been here for quite some time... Today I would like to swear in Robert Jake Nye to the Idaho City Police

Department."

Chief Watson reviewed some of the policies and duties and read: "The mission of Idaho City Police Department will be to protect and serve the public and citizens of Idaho City by preventing crime and disorder, and safeguarding lives and property. Law enforcement is a vital part of the community justice system. Law enforcement agencies, which include Idaho City Police, are expected to follow a code of ethics that reflects responsibilities of contemporary policing but adheres to the rich culture and tradition of Idaho City, Idaho."

Mayor Everhart swore in Jake Nye as a peace officer for Idaho City, Idaho. Everhart shook his hand and welcomed Officer Nye. Mayor Everhart spoke to those gathered, "I very much appreciate Jake's interest, his dedication to his work at the county, and I firmly believe that through the interview process, and I had the privilege of sitting in with Chief Watson, that he's going to do an amazing job here for us in this community. And the people that are here, obviously to support him, reinforces that

opinion that I have that he is going to do a fantastic job as our police officer. Thank you, all." Chief Watson reiterated that Nye would receive training he needed to do the job.

CLERK: Nancy Ptak spoke about the water bills and said that there were quite a few "with red marks" that had not been paid yet. She said, "The bills will be going up since it's the end of the month. There's not a whole lot that we can really do, other than send out the new bills and probably send out some shutoff notices with them. Unless they happen to come in, in the next day or two to get those taken care of."

MAYOR: Kenny Everhart thanked everyone that keep the city running, "the ones that make this town work." He then wished everyone a happy New

MONTGOMERY STREET: A constituent asked about the long-term goal for Montgomery Street. Chairman Secor said that there are some sewer concerns along that road that will need to be addressed after the water project. Mayor Everhart said that the city will pursue funding to repave the road. He added that they are monitoring the "soft spots" in the road and their plan for the spring is to excavate those areas, then fill them with better road material. Then they will add a layer of recycled asphalt and adjust the grading to allow the water to run off the road, rather than puddle on it. "With a limited budget, we try to do the best we can and try to keep them as smooth and passible as we can," Mayor Everhart said.

The next regular city council meeting was set to be held on January 8th, 2025.




