IDAHO CITY – The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) seeks representatives to fill vacancies on the Boise-Mores Watershed Advisory Group (WAG).

The Boise-Mores WAG is a group of citizens from a diverse set of interests dedicated to successful restoration and protection of Mores Creek, Grimes Creek, all tributaries upstream to the headwaters, Lucky Peak Reservoir, Arrowrock Reservoir, and the Middle Fork Boise River to the confluence of the North Fork Boise River.

The WAG is currently seeking representation from the following interest areas:

- Forestry and forest products
- Fisheries
- Idaho City municipal
- Recreation
- Tribal
- Local

The group will meet quarterly or as needed. Responsibilities

ties include working with DEQ on the following deliverables:

- Developing water quality improvement plans known as total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) for streams, lakes, and rivers with degraded water quality conditions within the watershed.
- Helping to identify contributing pollution sources in the watershed.
- Recommending specific actions needed to effectively control sources of pollution to the water bodies.
- Helping develop and implement a plan to meet water quality targets identified in the TMDLs.

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

February 4, 2025
Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan, and Lindy Lindstrom.

Pledge of Allegiance
CONSTITUENT INPUT: Alex Gross commented that he had gone up Tollgate Road from Robie Creek Road to help snow plow for a friend, and the road had not yet been plowed. Clerk Mary Prisco said that a number of homes and a subdivision were cut off from access to the main roads due to snow. Commissioners Tucker and Lindstrom said that they had heard all day from constituents about roads that had not been plowed.

TREASURER/ AUDITOR'S JOINT QUARTERLY REPORT: Clerk Prisco presented four quarters worth of reports. She said it was by statute that the treasurer and clerk auditor "need to be in balance on the statement of cash. There were a number of issues that occurred for the period that we're talking about, which is 1/1/2024 through 12/31/2024. So, we have resolved all those. We're also getting close to being able to close 2024, but there's been some issues with that." She suggested going through each quarter and explaining the balance. There was a late recording and journal entry for non-sufficient funds on two of the quarters that balanced out in the following quarter.

Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the treasurer/ auditor joint quarterly reports of quarter two, three, and four of 2024, and quarter one of fiscal year 2025. All were in favor and the motion carried.

CHECK PRINTER: Clerk Prisco said the purchase price for the check printer and the maintenance will be added to the "universal coverage" the county currently has in place. The total cost is \$1,260. Lindstrom motioned to authorize the purchase of a new check printer and the motion carried.

PROSECUTOR: A help-desk tracking issue software system was discussed by Prosecutor Alex Sosa, and he would like to expand this option. He said it could be beneficial for civil issues. Sosa suggested that he would like to discuss previous liability in closed executive session.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chairman Tucker motioned to go into executive session to discuss pending litigation. [Time 9:18 am to 9:26 am]

Coming back into session, there was no action required.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Tire service agreement was discussed, and a motion said to approve the agreement. Then Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the two part-time payroll additions for EMTs, and the motion carried.

Lindstrom then motioned to approve the annual agreement to allow the EBCAD to provide ambulance services for the Race to Robie Creek. The motion carried.

A thank you letter for the Collins family in response to their donation, which allowed for ambulance repairs and radios, was written by EBCAD Director Mari Adams and signed by her crew. Adams asked if the board of county commissioners would have an interest in signing the letter. "We're super grateful for everything that they've done for us," Adams added.

Lindstrom motioned to agree

to the signing of the thank you letter and the motion carried.

Two radio request purchases were discussed by Alex Gross. Lindstrom motioned to approve the radio request in the additional amount of around \$3,000 [inaudible]. Other radios for the ambulances were discussed with Motorola. The other two radios need to be repaired. An encrypted radio was discussed for the command truck. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to purchase one encrypted and two non-encrypted radios for \$19,415.56, money that was donated by the Collins family. The motion carried.

A new ambulance is anticipated to arrive in April or May.

EVALUATIONS: Prosecutor Sosa spoke about employee evaluations. An evaluation process was discussed. Clerk Prisco said she is confident that they can find something that would work well for their structure. Sheriff Scott Turner said they currently have a policy for evaluations.

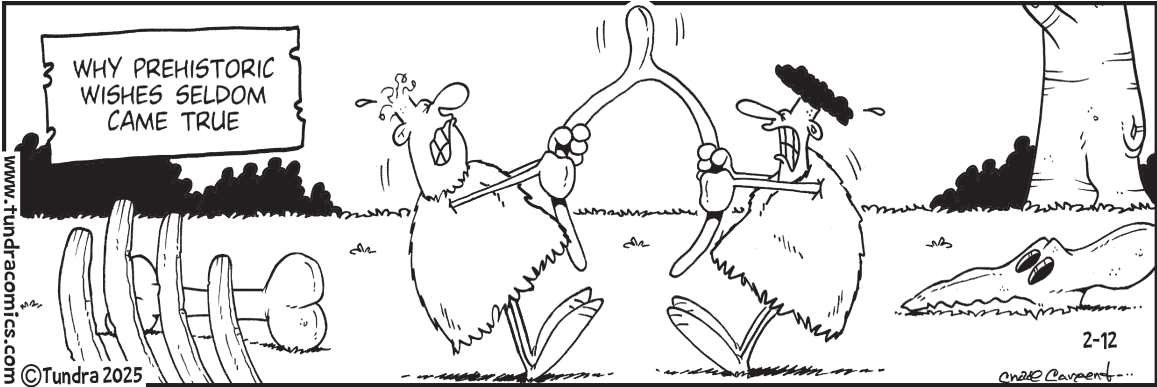
