Fires Scorch Boise County Early in the Year

BOISE COUNTY – The county got off to an early start with this year's fire season; there were two new fires reported this past week that quickly escalated due to the dry conditions. Although there is still snow on the ground in some parts of Boise County, Sheriff Scott Turner said that he was very concerned that there should be reports of wildfires in the beginning of March. Each of these fires was determined to be human-caused.

The first wildfire was located in the upper portion of the Robie Creek area and had the potential to spread among the pine trees and underbrush. The report came in early Friday evening on March 7th, indicating that a burn pile got out of

control and started burning in the surrounding forest. Fire departments responded from all over east Boise County, including from Robie Creek, Clear Wilderness Ranch, Creek, Thorn Creek, and Idaho City. The sheriff explained that they needed "more bodies" to fight this fire because only a few volunteers responded from Robie Creek. The Idaho Department of Lands also responded in time to provide some additional wildland protection. Due to the diligence of the volunteers in forming a line around the fire, the Robie Creek fire grew to less than an acre in size. However, the sheriff indicated that given the chance, it could have been a devastating fire due to the dry conditions.

The second fire occurred in Horseshoe Bend when a property owner ignited a burn pile on Sunday, March 9th. Due to the high winds, the fire spread to approximately 25 acres before it was contained by responding local fire departments from Horseshoe Bend, Garden Valley, and the City of Eagle. The fire spread to the hillside, igniting dry grasses. A cautionary evacuation notice was issued, in case the wind switched directions. Evacuation notices were canceled by that evening and the fire contained, but crews remained on the scene to watch for any potential flare

Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner explained that the Department of Lands and Bureau

of Land Management firefighters were not fully staffed at this point. He seemed discouraged to start off the fire season this early in March, and to see these incidents rapidly accelerate. He

warned that if residents planned on burning, they should have a water hose and shovel nearby. He also cautioned, "Don't bite off more than you can chew."

IDAHO CITY – An alert went out to the city of Idaho City on Wednesday, March 5th, to conserve water, due to a substantial leak. Idaho City Mayor Kenny Everhart emphasized that the drinking water had not been turned off, but some local residents did experience low water pressure during this period of time. The pumps at the filtration facility had been working harder than normal to fill the water lines; however, the major breaks still caused a reduction in the water pressure.

The mayor said that two large breaks had been discovered by Tuesday morning, March 11th. He explained that it had been a difficult endeavor, due to the standing water from melted snow to identify exactly where these leaks were occurring. One leak was isolated on Tuesday morning when a valve was closed by Main Street on Highway 21. The city had a substantial break in front of the Gold Mine cabins. Mayor Everhart explained that there

was a greater chance of breakage during the spring due to the thawing, freezing, and movement within the ground. Water pipes can sustain damage or breakage during this time of the year.

Mayor Everhart said there was also water line damage sustained within a property that would be the responsibility of the landowner(s) to fix. The water had been temporarily cut off to the customer to allow them to make the needed repairs.

The city public works will continue to search the affected area and locate any substantial issues. Idaho City issued a statement on March 11th: "The water will remain on unless the tank drops below 3 feet, at which point we will need to shut down the Highway 21 area again for the night until we can locate any additional leaks. We ask that you continue to conserve water as much as possible until we are sure all problems have been resolved. Thank you for your patience."



COUNTY COMMISS

March 4, 2025

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan, and Lindy Lindstrom.

Pledge of Allegiance **CONSTITUENT INPUT:** None

MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from February 18th and February 25th, 2025. The motions carried.

BUILDING PERMIT FEE: Commissioner Callahan noted that a yurt was donated to the Basin School District a few years ago for their outdoor education program. He said, "We have a bunch of volunteers coming together to help get that yurt put together to add to their outdoor program." The school asked if they could get the building permit fee waived. Commissioner Lindstrom had no problem with the request. Chairman Tucker stated, "We've waived permit fees for other government entities before; I don't see why we would charge this one." Lindstrom motioned to approve Planning and Zoning's request to waive the building permit fee and the motion carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE: Jeremy Braughton said they were short a couple of trailers and that there was only one trailer left to transport equipment between the three districts. He said that they need to travel to Idaho City to use their trailer and added, "We're not being productive. That's not saving taxpayers' money by any means. It's actually costing them more money. We're not trying to buy something new. We're trying to buy something that's 24-years-old," but the quality is the best for the price. He said, "It looks like it's brand new." There are new tires and new decking, and Braughton talked the seller down another couple thousand dollars. Lindstrom motioned to approve Road and Bridge to purchase the trailer for \$34,100. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve a payroll addition for a seasonal employee to help with roads, up to 40 hours a week. The motion carried

WILDFIRE COORDINA-

TOR: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the hiring of a new Wildfire Mitigation Coordinator for up to 40 hours a week.

GRANT PROPOSAL: A grant proposal for the Middle

Fork, Payette hazardous fuels reduction grant was discussed with Prosecutor Alex Sosa. Lindstrom motioned to approve the grant proposal approval and signature. The motion carried.

Another grant proposal was discussed for hazardous fuels reduction in the Lowman area. Callahan inquired if the grant required a monetary match, and Wildfire Mitigation Coordinator Jordan Jones said there was none. Lindstrom motioned to approve this grant approval and signature. The motion carried.

Jones said that the Emergency Manager position was still open. The job description will be posted and interviews planned for a future date.

SHERIFF: Sheriff Scott Turner spoke about a mass gathering agreement for law enforcement that will require four deputies for the Lucky Peak Regatta. Callahan said it was a "cool event, a speed boat race at Spring Shores." Tucker said he might have to check it out. Lindstrom motioned to approve the sheriff to provide law enforcement and traffic control for the event [June 26-29]. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION: There was a resolution for record destruction and the prosecutor said that he was "fairly confident" that all of the documents were "semi-permanent and can be destroyed" five years after the relevent date. Lindstrom motioned to approve Resolution 2025-15 Records for Destruction, and the motion carried.

SNOW REMOVAL: Lindstrom motioned to pay bills for snow removal in the amount of

\$630 and another for \$1,050. county prosecutor before mak-The motions carried.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the agreement for the ambulance service to cover the annual Idaho City 100 motorcycle event.

EBCAD Director Mari Adams reported that she had been talking with Air St. Luke's and they are willing to donate an ambulance to EBCAD. She shared, "They saw everything that we've been going through, our articles and everything. So, they reached out to me and said that they had a 2012 4-wheel drive ambulance that they're working on getting to us." It is coming from Twin Falls. She added, "It's got a lot of miles, but they really service all their stuff and take really good care of it." Commissioner Callahan commented that the miles were likely more highway miles and thanked her for sharing the "good news."

BUILDING PERMIT: A building permit for five shipping containers was discussed, and added noncompliance fees of \$1,300. Planning and Zoning cautioned that their decision would "set a precedence." The board will consult the ing a decision. **EXECUTIVE SESSION:**

A motion was said to enter a closed meeting to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 9:48 am to 10:03 am]

PUBLIC HEARING: The Deer Ridge at Spring Valley Miner's Subdivision in Horseshoe Bend was discussed. A PowerPoint presentation was prepared by Planning and Zoning. The road was said to be within county standards, but there are two cattle guards and the applicant asked for a variance. There will be four lots, and currently there are three with power. They would like to start with four lots and may expand to twelve lots. There was no further testimony, but one public comment had been submitted. The applicant explained that the reason why they are dividing the property is to provide land for their adult children to build and live on.



Car Accident on Highway 21



The undercarriage of the car can be seen by the first tuft of willows along the shoreline, while the car itself continued on, passing the pine tree that should have tipped it into the cold waters of Mores Creek.

IDAHO CITY -- An accident occurred on Saturday, March 8th when a vehicle left the roadway and nearly went into Mores Creek. The Idaho City woman was with her young child, buckled into a car seat. It was a sheer miracle to deputies that the vehicle did not topple over into the fastmoving creek. The tire marks in the snow indicated that the car must have somehow ridden along the steep incline of the bank, remarkably missed a pine tree, and come to rest in the willows. An ambulance was at the scene, but other than being a bit shaken, the emergency medical personnel observed that the two occupants were just fine. Should the car have gone into the creek, it is possible that it would have been submerged in the icy waters.

Garden Valley Heads to the Basketball State Finals



Boise County Search and Rescue's Mission

BOISE COUNTY -- Boise County Search and Rescue (BCSAR) is a nonprofit organization that supports the Boise County Sheriff's department and local agencies with needed rescues. BCSAR is an all-volunteer organization that assists individuals and groups that have been struck by an emergency event in the wilderness of Boise County or the surrounding area, and request assistance from an agency. The missions are dispatched to BCSAR via the Boise County Sheriff's Dispatch Center. BC-SAR is completely funded by donations and the members of the team.

thousand hours of rescue missions and training in 2024. BC-SAR has responded to five or more missions so far in 2025. On one such past mission, the search and rescue team located a father and son who had been stranded on the mountain overnight. They were found, provided with medical assistance, and returned to their loved ones safely.

Sheriff Scott Turner said the following about BCSAR: "As Sheriff, one of the statutory obligations is search and rescue. With limited resources and manpower, organizations such as this provide a vital service and fill a huge gap. Being a local organization builds

a higher level of care and concern in their own backyard, so to speak. BCSAR has deployed on several missions that would have taken deputies away from emergency calls, and to their credit had great success."

Sheriff Scott Turner helps in supporting the BCSAR. He provides power sports equipment to assist in the rescue missions. This includes ATVs, UTVs, and snowmobiles. He completed the required background checks which are mandatory for all team members, and the BCSAR team has used the sheriff's spaces for meetings and training. The county covers the insurance for the BCSAR Jeep, which is used for rescue missions. The working relationship between the sheriff's department and the BSCAR team is a vital part of the BCSAR success.

The BCSAR team helps ensure there is a fast response time to an emergency event. Without the team, the response would come from the workforce of the Boise County Sheriff's Department. They would be required to pull the workforce off their normal duty or bring in off-shift deputies to respond. The BCSAR team provides additional resources to the county.

Our County Commissioner Bob Callahan had this to say about the BCSAR, "Boise County Search and Rescue are a great asset to our county. With the increased population in the valley, more and more people look to Boise County for their recreational needs. Working


HORSESHOE BEND -- On Tuesday, March 4, while replacing a utility pole at Locking Horns Riverside Restaurant, Idaho Power accidentally struck the City of Horseshoe Bend's main water line, disrupting water access for much of the city. As a result, businesses located south of the canal and the Horseshoe Bend School District were forced to shut down from around 10:30 a.m. until the early hours of March 5.
