The day started with the athletes' bus getting stuck in the icy terrain coming into Terrace Lakes Resort. Justin Pedersen of Fair n Square construction was there to save the day and pull the bus to safety. During the opening ceremonies we enjoyed a live version of the National Anthem by Rick Scott. Rick was joined by one of the athletes to finish the song

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

February 25, 2025
Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan, and Lindy Lindstrom.
Pledge of Allegiance
CONSTITUENT INPUT: A constituent from the Clear Creek area commented, “Over the last couple of years, we’ve been losing some of our assets of Boise County, mainly paved roads that have big ol’ potholes in ‘em. About a year and a half ago, it started out as a couple of nice little small ones, but now we almost have the Grand Canyon.” He spoke about an area from Highway 21, turning onto Grimes Creek Road, where the traffic diverts to miss potholes and could cause an accident. Commissioner Lindstrom said that the road is a topic of discussion with the new road superintendent and they are going to try some different techniques.
MINUTES: None
ROAD AND BRIDGE PAYROLL CHANGE: Commissioner Lindstrom asked if they needed to first meet with the prosecutor in a closed session. Boise County Prosecutor Alex Sosa recommended going into executive session to discuss the matter.
EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Tucker motioned to go into executive session and the motion carried. [Time 9:09am to 9:46am] Coming back into session, Lindstrom motioned to approve the payroll addition change for an equipment operator to a Road and Bridge Superintendent. All were in favor and the motion carried.
CLAIMS APPROVAL REPORT: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve, after much discussion, the claims approval report in the amount of \$324,855.12. The repairs to the ambulances were included. The motion carried.
EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: There were several more letters approved by the board that were sent out to volunteers who had not met their 24-hour quota each month. EBCAD Director Mari Adams said that she hopes this motivates some volunteers, so that she can take some time off and not make as many runs in the ambulance. Lindstrom motioned to approve the letters for signature and the motion carried. A part-time position was also approved through a motion. There was another repair needed on the Unit 15 ambulance, and Adams said that the repair

place was working with them on the price of \$4,500 to repair the turbos. Commissioner Callahan commented, “Saving lives costs money.”
COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Amanda Leader said that this was a big day, because there were to be twenty individuals sentenced in court. She commented that last year there were over 70 people that had community service, and this year that number has decreased to about 20. Leader was appreciative of having a phone for her assistant and a working computer.
ROAD AND BRIDGE: Jeremy Braughton gave an update and said that they were busy working on the roads.
EMERGENCY MANAGER: There were some wildfire mitigation work highlighted for Clear Creek, Wilderness Ranch, and Terrace Lakes.
ASSESSOR: Chris Juszczak said, “We’re as busy as can be crunching numbers and short-staffed.” He will have another staff member coming on in March, and one remaining open position.
PLANNING AND ZONING: Alex Gross said that everything was running smoothly in his office.
SHERIFF: Chairman Tucker asked how it was going, and Sheriff Scott Turner replied, “Rockslides, avalanches, cars that hit rocks, but a lot of search and rescues in the last week. We’ve had one every day for like five days.” There were also a lot of court transports with a jury trial coming up, which has been busy.
EBCAD: Mari Adams said they were short-staffed and reported that there are “people saying that they are going to volunteer, and the night before saying, ‘No, sorry, I’m not doing it.’ So, I’m having to cover a lot of shifts.” She said that the Unit 13 ambulance is still in the process of being repaired. Unit 14 has turbos that need to be replaced, and she is considering if it is worth it to make the repairs, and was “afraid of what will happen next.”
IT: Upgrades to the phone system and new computers were discussed.
PROSECUTOR: Alex Sosa reported that his office was fully staffed, and said, “I greatly appreciate the commissioners giving me the tools to be able to prosecute more offenses in Boise County.” He foresees streamlining the criminal cases for the criminal justice system, and he anticipates being more

accessible for the commissioners.
COMMISSIONERS: Commissioner Callahan said, “I just appreciate everyone working hard and doing their job well.” Chairman Tucker agreed and said, “Everything seems to be running fairly smoothly. The roads are not in the best of shape, but we’re working on that.” Callahan added, “We’ll get there.” Tucker said, “Everything else seems to be on the up and up.”
EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Tucker motioned to go into a closed session to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 10:17am to 10:32am] No action was required.
EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Tucker again called an executive session to discuss pending litigation. [Time 10:32am to 11:06am] No action was required.
ALL-HAZARD MITIGATION MEETING: Bradley Peterson and Jordan Jones joined the meeting. Forester Peterson said it was going to be a fast-moving pace and he plans to have a deadline of October 1st. He said that mitigation work was looking into the future, “an action, it’s some sort of work that’s done to save lives in the future and prevent infrastructure damage.” Peterson spoke about identifying issues, problems that should be addressed, and the potential for funding. A new all-hazard mitigation plan was discussed and the prospect of getting the public involved. There were suggested presentations for community members and a survey to be done by landowners. This will help rate hazards, including wildfires, flooding, earthquakes, avalanches, pandemics, etc. This would work with FEMA, but everything is currently on hold, “They aren’t having any meetings right now.” Peterson added that he was pretty confident that there would still be money available for projects. “The one thing that the Trump administration did when he first came in was, he actually increased funding

for mitigation. He’s a realtor, he sees the value in prevention and protection.”

COMPASS: A meeting was held that Commissioner Lindstrom attended. He commented, “They are very eager to serve Boise County. And I told them that when our weather is good enough, we can show them all the bad roads.” [As stated on their website: “The Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) is the forum for regional collaboration in southwest Idaho that helps maintain a healthy and economically vibrant region, offering people choices in how and where they live, work, play, and travel.”] Adjourned at 12:29pm.

They were closely followed by the junior team, Basin Innovator, who secured 3rd place in the competition by demonstrating their creativity, critical thinking and teamwork in designing a seed spreader. Elementary Principal Jamie Pilkerton commented, “We are very proud of our students and the creativity, problem-solving and collaboration they demonstrated throughout the design and presentation process.”

Beware of Scams Targeting Idaho Power Customers



BOISE COUNTY -- This week is National Consumer Protection Week, and Idaho Power reminds customers to remain vigilant against scammers.

Phone scams targeting Idaho Power customers — both homes and businesses — have been on the rise. These scams involve spoofing Idaho Power’s phone number and demanding immediate payment or service will be discon-

nected. Idaho Power never demands payment over the phone or requests payment through pre-paid cards.

Be aware of these common scams. Idaho Power NEVER:

- Demands immediate payment over the phone
- Requires a payment for a defective meter
- Asks for same-day payment via pre-paid cards, such as the Green Dot MoneyPak
- Accepts pre-paid cards, like Visa or Green Dot
- Asks customers to pay using Bitcoin or QR codes

One way to stop scammers is to be familiar with your account. Use My Account or download their mobile app to check your bill details, sign up for account alerts, and make secure payments

If you are contacted by someone claiming to be from Idaho Power and anything seems suspicious, hang up and call Idaho Power Customer Service immediately at 208-388-2323 or 1-800-488-6151 (outside the Treasure Valley).

Veterans with Disabilities Can Apply for Property Tax Benefit

BOISE COUNTY – March 4, 2025 – Some Idaho veterans with disabilities are eligible to have their property tax bill reduced by as much as \$1,500 on their Idaho residence and up to one acre of land.

Veterans can apply for the benefit online at tax.idaho.gov/ptr. They also have the option to get a paper application on the Tax Commission’s website at tax.idaho.gov or from their county assessor. They must apply online or file the application with their county assessor by Tuesday, April 15.

the benefit each year. However, veterans with documented permanent and total disabilities don’t need to reapply each year. Their benefit will renew automatically.

When applying, applicants need to include a current letter from the VA confirming their 100% service-connected disability rating or their 100% compensation due to individual unemployability as of January 1, 2025.

Veterans might qualify for a property tax benefit in 2025 if both of these apply:

- They’re recognized as a 100% service-connected disabled veteran or receive 100% compensation from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) due to individual unemployability.
- They own and live in a home in Idaho that’s their primary residence before April 15, 2025.
- The property must have a current homeowner’s exemption.
- The home can be a mobile home.

There are no income limits. Most veterans must apply for
