### Idaho State Police Investigating Two-Vehicle Crash on Hwy 55

**BOISE COUNTY** -- A two-vehicle injury crash occurred on Sunday, June 15, 2025, at 8:13 PM on northbound State Highway 55 near milepost 76.7.

According to Idaho State Police, a 32-year-old male from Hamilton, Montana was traveling southbound in a 2012 Chevy Silverado when he crossed the center line, colliding head-on with a 2023 Harley Davidson FLH Series motorcycle traveling northbound.

The motorcycle was carrying a 46-year-old male driver from

Troy, Montana, and a 38-year-old female passenger from Elko, Nevada. The force of the impact separated both riders from the motorcycle, leaving them in the middle of the roadway. The Chevy Silverado came to a stop on the right side of the highway.

Emergency responders transported the female passenger via air ambulance to a nearby hospital, while the motorcycle driver was taken by ground ambulance. Both were wearing helmets at the time of the crash. The Chevy driver, who was wearing a seatbelt, did not require transportation.

Authorities closed all lanes of travel for approximately four hours to provide emergency assistance. The Idaho State Police continue to investigate the incident.

# COUNTY COMMISSI

Commissioners **Present:** Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan and Lindy Lindstrom.

Pledge of Allegiance **CONSTITUENT INPUT:** None

**OPPORTUNI-GRANT** TIES: Davy Robinson spoke highly competitive about grants that open for application in October or January. He would like to build costs and history about this county. He spoke about risk and reward. Hiring a grant writer was discussed.

**MINUTES:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from 5-27-2025 and the motion carried. He then motioned to approve the 6-3-2025 and 6-5-2025 special meeting. The motions carried.

SOLID WASTE: A proposed fee increase was discussed. A representative from the solid waste department stated, "Because we do have a problem. It's losing money." Currently, two tires are free for disposal, with a charge for additional tires, but the department is proposing that each tire cost \$3 to dispose of and \$5 for the wheel. Large truck tires would be \$20, or \$30 with the wheel. The representative added that, "People aren't going to like it, but then they'll get used to it." Furniture is \$5, but the department is interested in bumping it to \$10. Extraordinarily large items will be considered and may be charged by weight. Refrigerators and freezers were "right in the ballpark" for the cost to empty the freon, so their price will remain the same at \$20. Lately, there has been more land debris than the Garden Valley brush pit is equipped to handle. There are quite a few stumps that cannot be burned. for one condition. DEQ will eventually disallow burning. There was also a big concern about home contrac-

tors dumping at the county sites and ways to encourage contractors to haul debris elsewhere for landfill, not a county transfer station. Increasing the fee per ton was also discussed. "We can't be bleeding money for the county. Unfortunately, the residents are the folks that are going to have to help us out here," the representative from solid waste said. "We lost over \$100,000 in 2024."

Holding a public hearing for the fee increases was discussed for a future date.

**AVIMOR:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the Avimor Judge Subdivision Board signature, "accepting dedication of roads." All were in favor and the motion carried.

TRAIL CREEK SUBDIVI-**SION**: Planning and Zoning's Alex Gross explained that a few adjustments were made to the plat for the subdivision, and therefore the subdivision needed a signature by the board. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to amend the plat of Trail Creek Meadows #1 for the board's signature.

**PUBLIC HEARING: Chair**man Tucker called the hearing to order to discuss forming a new subdivision. Shoshone subdivision, which means "white elk," would be located off of Severance Road in Garden Valley. Improvements were made to the road so that gravel can be added. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner submitted a letter concerning additional water storage of 5,000 for the new subdivision to help with fire suppression. There was no other public response. Planning and zoning recommended conditions of approval. The conditions were reviewed by the board and Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the conditions of approval except

ROAD AND BRIDGE: Hiring an admin assistant for a few days of the week was discussed. The issue will be tabled until next week.

TRAIN-**EMERGENCY ING**: Sheriff Turner explained that grant money would be used for this extensive training for his department and all the fire departments. It would be a weekend training, utilizing evacuation mapping. Sheriff Turner said it was important training and something they had never done before. He added, "We're trying to get all of the emergency responses in the county on the same wavelength, because from last year, it's not a question of if, it's a matter of when. And with the potential fire season looking like it's going to be this year, again, we're just trying to be as prepared as we can be." This training would occur on the 21st and 22<sup>nd</sup> of June. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to purchase mass evacuation exercise training through a company in the amount of \$7,500. All were in favor and the motion carried. The sheriff confided that class normally costs that amount per a person, and Boise County will be able to have over twenty people attend for that total amount cost.

**FORESTER**: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the roadside mastication contract, access agreement with the Wilderness Ranch Homeowners Association. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Terrace Lakes and Lowman Chipper Days were discussed.

Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the Good Neighbor Agreement Chipper Days Contract. The motion carried.

CHECK PRINTER: Clerk Mary Prisco said that the check printer that was previously approved in February has experienced some issues that needed to be fixed. Lindstrom motioned to approve a contract with a company for a new check printer in the amount of \$1,260. The motion carried.

**WEEDS:** Lindstrom motioned to approve the FY2026 USFS agreement for weed management [in the burned areas] in the amount of \$32,228 and the motion carried.

The Idaho Transportation Department also approves funds for killing weeds. An individual from the Weeds Department said, "We have not historically spent all that money, because our highways are becoming so busy that it is dangerous to be out there. And the state is equipped with these big vehicles that drive behind their spray rigs, so if something hits them, they hit that instead of the spray rig. So, we're out there, we are trying to be cautious on days that are low traffic, early mornings, that type of thing." Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the noxious weeds agreement with ITD in the amount of \$5,100 and the motion carried.

**CLAIMS APPROVAL RE-PORT**: There were no further questions, so Lindstrom motioned to approve the claims approval report in the amount of \$85,052.62. The motion car-

ADA COUNTY HIGH-WAY DISTRICT: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the demand warrant to Ada County Highway District in the amount of \$33,000 for a Kenworth 2012 asphalt patcher truck and a 2009 international water truck. All were in favor and the motion carried.

**CLERK**: A motion was said to make a payment to the "postal reserve" in the amount of \$2,000 and the motion car-

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Prosecutor Sosa explained that there was a second executive session for risk management. Lindstrom motioned to go into executive session to discuss risk management and to hire an employee. [Time 12:16pm to 12:37pm] No action was required.

### Fire Danger is Rising as Summer Sets with Warmer Days

**BOISE COUNTY** — Fire season is ramping up in Idaho, and on Thursday, June 12, a wildfire—referred to as the Goose Creek Fire—was spotted near Crouch and Garden Valley. Multiple helicopters equipped with water buckets were seen working the area throughout the afternoon, responding swiftly to the blaze.

Given the timing and recent lightning storms, officials believe the fire was likely caused by a lightning strike, though the exact cause remains under investigation.

For those tracking wildfire activity, the Idaho Fire Map from the Department of Lands provides real-time updates on all reported wildfires across the state, including smaller incidents that may not appear on national platforms. It's a valuable tool for staying informed as fire season intensifies. Stay alert and safe out there.

# More About Idaho

Idaho History 1800 to Present ~ By Skip Myers

### Rocky Bar, Idaho

Rocky Bar is a ghost town in Elmore County, Idaho, United States. At its height in the late 19th century, Rocky Bar boasted a population of over 2,500 and served as county seat of Alturas County from 1864 to 1882. It was also the original county seat of Elmore County when it was created in 1889.


Rocky Bar was founded in December 1863, soon after gold was discovered along the nearby Feather River. Within two years, it became the main settlement in the area and was even considered as a possible capital for Idaho Territory. The town was destroyed by fire in 1892. Although it was rebuilt, afterwards it began a slow decline. Rocky Bar has not had a permanent population since the 1960s.

Rocky Bar is located 62 miles northeast of Mountain Home.

# The Abbott Family Tragedy: Gunfire and Grief

In the early 1870s of Idaho, Asa Abbott sat on the school board as a respected man with heavy responsibilities. One of those was came with the decision to hire David Hannor, a new teacher in town. Along with the job came room and board at Asa's home—an arrangement that would set in motion a chain of heartbreak and violence.

Hannor soon made unwanted advances toward Asa's eldest daughter, Laura—just 13 years old. Outraged and protective, Asa immediately dismissed him. Then, fearing further danger, he sent his children to Missouri to live and study with their grandparents.

But Hannor wasn't done.

That same year, Hannor sought the position of school superintendent at the convention in Centerville. Asa, de-

termined to stop him, delivered a blistering statement: "First, he is an educated fool. Second, his heart is as black as the ace of spades. And third, he is not competent for the position."

Hannor was denied. Furious, he threatened Asa, vowing to "put daylight" through him unless he offered a public apology.


On June 26, 1870, tragedy struck. Asa, his brother William, and a hired hand named Lloyd Curlin rode into Placerville for supplies. Hannor was waiting. He confronted Asa immediately. Tensions escalated. William tried to intervene, but harsh words flew like sparks in dry grass.

Hannor reached for his weap-

on—a monstrous pistol with nine shots and a shotgun barrel in the center—but it jammed. Asa drew and fired first but missed. Then came a barrage of gunfire. When the smoke cleared, Hannor and William lay dead in the dusty street.

Authorities arrested Asa and Lloyd Curlin. The charge: murder. The trials that followed captivated the territory. The first ended in a hung jury. But the second brought relief—Asa and Lloyd were acquitted on the grounds of self-defense.

The cost, though, was unbearable.

In July, William's brother George, acting as executor, sold off William's ranch to James Hoey for \$1,500. That included the house, all tools and machinery, and shares in the vital Toll Road and the Alder Creek water ditch that the brothers had built together.

By October, a broken Asa sold his own 1,000-acre ranch—house, titles, crops, water rights, ditches, and road interests—to his younger brother David and David's wife Susan for \$10,850. Unable to bear the weight of having killed his brother—even in self-defense—and the chaos Hannor


had brought to his family, Asa packed up his wife Anna and their children. Taking only four mules, he left Idaho behind for Texas.

Two years later, David and Susan sold the land—"The Abbott Ranch"—for just \$3,300. They kept the water and Toll Road rights and returned to Savannah, Missouri, with a new daughter they named "Idaho."

Then came the final blow. In January 1873, news traveled north: Asa had taken his own life in Denison, Texas. The tragedy had never left him. Grief had been his final frontier.

Anna returned to Idaho with the children—her third crossing of the plains. That December, she remarried. Her new husband, a widower named Asa Crapo Spooner, brought a second chance. Together, they moved to the Wood River, trying to rebuild a life haunted by gunfire, grief, and ghosted dreams.
