### A Legacy of Giving: The History of the Syringa Club

**GARDEN VALLEY** -- In the fall of 1915, in Garden Valley, a group of spirited women gathered at the home of Mrs. Thomas Wetzel to celebrate a bridal shower for Gladys B. Charters. Amid the laughter and conversation, the idea of forming a local women's organization began to take root. Just weeks later, that idea blossomed into the Syringa Club, with Mrs. Gladys White Bell elected as its first president and the name "Syringa" suggested by Miss Mary L. Mills—a fitting tribute to Idaho's state flower and a symbol of grace, strength, and community.

What began as a small, local club soon grew in purpose and stature. In 1921, the Syringa Club joined the Southwestern Idaho District Federation and later affiliated with the State Federation, gaining wider influence while maintaining deep local roots.

From its inception, the Syringa Club was defined by its tireless pursuit of community betterment—especially in the field of education. The women of Syringa played a pivotal role in the founding and continued support of Garden Valley High School, the only high school in Boise County. Their commitment ensured that generations of local children had access to quality education close to home.

The Club's efforts extended beyond advocacy. Members placed their personal library into the school for students and teachers, only to lose it to a tragic fire within the first year. Demonstrating resilience and the power of community, other

federated clubs rallied, donating books to rebuild the collection. The Syringa Club also replaced the school piano lost in the fire and continued to invest in school needs—donating 50 folding chairs in 1948 and helping fund a motion picture projector for both educational and community use.

The Syringa Club's vision also encompassed broader civic projects. Early on, members built and maintained bathhouses at local hot springs, leased and fenced a picnic ground, and took on the upkeep of the Valley Cemetery. They created a monument on Alder Creek road to Charles Ostner, and even placed cement markers on isolated pioneer graves along the canyon road, preserving pieces of local history.

Their charitable work reached far beyond Garden Valley. The Club regularly sent books to the State Tuberculosis Hospital in Gooding and provided annual monetary donations and fresh fruit to the Children's Home in Boise. Their efforts during national emergencies were notable, even pausing meetings to support Red Cross work during wartime.

One of the Club's most memorable accomplishments was the creation and performance of a historical pageant celebrating the pioneers of Garden Valley. With a cast representing local families and over seventy-five head of livestock—including pack strings, freight wagons, logging teams, and a prospector with his donkey—the pageant brought the Valley's rich heritage to life for the entire community.

Fundraising was as creative as it was consistent. Through dances, carnivals, auctions, and other community events, the Club raised funds not only for local needs but also for broader causes, including the polio drive. Their floats in the Boise County Fair parade were award-winning, and their generosity extended to donating \$500 toward the Community Hall and investing another \$500 in savings bonds for future needs.

Throughout its decades of service, the Syringa Club welcomed all women who wished to contribute and make friends, regardless of the changing tides of mining or lumber industries that brought families in and out of the Valley. It became more than a club—it was a cornerstone of community life, a circle of support and service for generations.

Though the Syringa Club eventually closed its doors, its

legacy lives on in the community and school it helped build, the lives it touched, and the traditions of civic pride it inspired. It remains a shining example of what dedicated individuals can accomplish when united

by purpose and passion.



### Traffic delays expected on Highway 55 north of Horseshoe Bend August 5th thru 7th



**HORSESHOE BEND** – Drivers on State Highway 55 can expect short traffic delays north of Horseshoe Bend Aug. 5–7 as crews drill to collect roadway samples in preparation for a future pavement rehabilitation project.

Crews will be working at multiple locations within a one-mile stretch of the highway north of town. Each sample will take approximately one hour to collect, with single lane closures in place during that

time. Flaggers will direct traffic through the work zones.

The road will remain open throughout the operation, but drivers should plan for brief delays and reduced speeds. The Idaho Transportation Department asks motorists to slow down in the work zone for the safety of travelers and work crews.

# BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

July 22, 2025

**Present:** Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan (via phone) and Lindy Lindstrom.

**[Recording started at 9:50 am – well into the meeting]**

At the beginning of the recorded portion, Commission Tucker asked, "How would we get an agreement with the Forest Service to do some work on some of these roads?" An individual via phone discussed a "master agreement" that could bring in funding for maintenance. Tucker then asked how some of these roads had become Boise County roads? The individual said that some were granted to the county for easements or were RS2477. Prosecutor Alex Sosa asked about Arrowrock Road, and they replied that it was recognized as a public right of way and a public road by a court decree back in 1994 or 1995. Prosecutor Sosa opened the discussion up to ask the "two engineers on the phone" any additional questions. They asked that the county contact them if they were interested in proceeding with this agreement.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Prosecutor Sosa asked to follow up with an executive session to discuss this matter later in the day.

**PUBLIC HEARING:** Planning and Zoning Administrator Alex Gross spoke about a subdivision located north of Horseshoe Bend, on the east side of the highway, in the Hansen subdivision. There is a parcel under the two-acre min-

imum, and the individual came in to request a variance. They are also working with Central District Health regarding a modified septic system. There were no public objections, and the meeting was properly noticed on the property, in the newspaper, and letters were sent to agencies and surrounding landowners. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the variance as drafted. The motion carried.

**CLAIMS APPROVAL:** There were no questions and Commission Lindstrom motioned to approve claims approval in the amount of \$367,241.06. The motion carried.

**LIQUOR LICENSES:** There were motions to approve two liquor licenses, which were approved.

**AIR ST. LUKE'S:** A motion was said to approve a demand warrant to Air St. Luke's in the amount of \$55. The motion carried.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** The emergency manager requested an executive session regarding "risk management." A motion was said to enter the closed session. [Time 10:19 to 10:51 am] Coming back into session, no action was required.

**TAX DEEDS:** Treasurer Gina Turner said that there were six tax deeds - five are owned a single corporation - that are denying ownership and "refusing all of our mail." The other deed belongs to an individual that refused to pay. The individuals have until September 2026 to pay for 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024 taxes "and then

they can redeem the property." Otherwise, the county will sell the property at auction in September 2026, including penalties and interest. The name will change to Boise County; they will sell the property and take out the fees and Sheriff's fees. The excess funds go back to the owner.

**EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE:** Mari Adams said that a full-time employee had quit, and a part time employee was interested in being a full-time employee. Therefore, Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the payroll addition change to 40-hours a week. For the employee that quit, an accrual needed to be paid. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to pay out an accrual of \$36,537.53. The motion carried.

Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve Resolution 2025-02 for the East Boise County Ambulance District for donated money from the Collins family for repairs, training and a newer ambulance.

Lindstrom motioned to approve a second resolution to accept a grant for computers.

The newer ambulance from Wisconsin, bought with donated money from the Collins family, is being released the end of July and EBCAD is working on shipping the vehicle. Adams said the grant ambulance from 2021 is currently getting new logos and they expect to have it by the end of August.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Prosecutor Sosa recommended going into the closed session to discuss a "risk management"

issue. Commissioner Lindstrom made the motion, and the motion carried. [Time 11:09 am to 12:02 pm] No action was required.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Assessor Chris Juszczak was asked to be present for a land acquisition closed session. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to go into executive session to discuss the acquiring of real property. [Time 1:37 pm to 2:12 pm] No action was required.

**BUDGET DISCUSSION FY2026:** Clerk Mary Prisco started by saying that she and another from her office had "been doing this in a very short timeframe and so I have not had the opportunity to proof anything. So, I guess I'm telling you my disclaimer on some of the information, but we've done our best, certainly." She said this was the "first run" of the balanced budget. The information was referred to and available on the commissioners' laptops. Prisco said that property tax increased \$309,000 from the prior year. She said there was a shift that was concerning for the Justice Fund of \$500,000. Sales tax revenue was going down,

an estimated \$307,490 revenue to allocate, and Road and Bridge's budget was still half a million short. Clerk Prisco said that \$5.8 million was the total cost of salaries currently, and with a three percent cost of living moves that to \$6.167 million for the next fiscal year.

Clerk Prisco said, "It's super, super easy to make mistakes. It's a lot of data, also we're one week away from being extremely short-staffed." She pointed out departments, expense, and revenue. Chairman Tucker clarified that, "The grand total on the salary portion, because of the benefits, that is inaccurate." Clerk Prisco said that on the spreadsheets, it was accurate.

Sheriff Turner added that they need to "take care of the employees that they have, because none of us can afford to lose any more employees." Clerk Prisco agreed with the sheriff, but said they are limited on financial resources.

**ORDINANCES:** Prosecutor Sosa spoke about ordinance changes, including those for juveniles who have several contacts with law enforcement. Land closures and no parking signs were also discussed.

## Idaho History 1800 to Present By Skip Myers

The *Owyhee Avalanche* newspaper headlines describe J. Marion More being shot on the streets of Silver City during the Owyhee Mine War. More received a shot near the center of the breast. He ran about 50 yards and fell in front of the Oriental Restaurant, into which he was immediately carried. Experienced physicians pronounced him in a critical condition, and he died several hours later. His real name was John Neptune Marion More and some spelled it Moore.

More was of the firm of More and Fogus and was widely known in Idaho mining circles. He belonged to the Masonic Fraternity in Silver City. He was known in Silver City and Idaho City as a mining investor.

Originally, John N. More moved from his initial home in Anderson County, Tennessee (northwest of Knoxville) to a Locust Creek farm (west of Linneus) in Linn County, Missouri, where his father was a prominent Southern Methodist. His parents, Joseph C. Moore (May 1, 1791-May 19, 1873) and Jane Pate, were married in August 1829 in Knox County. Their eldest son, John, headed west to California as a gold rush emigrant at about

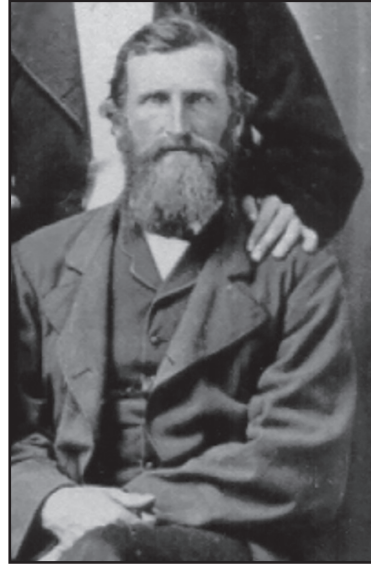
age 20. Settling in Mariposa, he became an undersheriff to Thomas Early. After a little less than a decade in California, an embarrassing fracas of some sort induced him to head north to Washington, where he disguised himself as J. Marion More. From then on, he went to great care to conceal his original identity as John N. Moore, although many of his old Mariposa friends continued to remember him that way.

J. Marion More, in the meantime, had recovered financially enough to assume an interest in Ida-Elmore properties on top of War Eagle Mountain, which is southwest of Boise about 70 miles and south of Silver City, past the Fairview Cemetery. More participated effectively in negotiating with the rival Golden Chariot interests--who were located on an outcrop of the same vein--to settle a bitter mining war over ownership of the ledge. The mining war had pretty much ended by the beginning of April of 1868, but hard feelings persisted on both sides. Stimulated by a round of drinks with his Idaho-Elmore friends a few days after the end of the conflict, More was unfortunate enough to meet up with Sam Lockhart, a Golden Chariot strike-breaker, in front

of the Idaho Hotel, located on Main Street in Silver City, on the afternoon of April first. Heated words flew back and forth. Lockhart defended his honor with his pistol and shot More in the chest, just as More was about to strike him with a walking stick. More died three hours later.

At his funeral in Idaho City a few days later, a thousand old friends gathered at his grave to mourn the death of one of Idaho's more famous mining pioneers.

Mores Creek is a tributary of the Boise River. Misspellings often find their way into place names, so it's not surprising that it has also been known as Moore Creek and Moore's Creek. J. Marion More, for whom the stream is named, used both last names himself, so the confusion is not surprising.

Majestic Mountain Ranch currently features four cabins and the Stirling Suites, each with clawfoot tubs, full kitchens, outdoor hot tubs, and Shelly's own photography adorning the walls. "I always dreamed of selling my art to a hotel," she said. "Now it's part of the ranch."

Amenities include shampoo, body wash, snacks, teas, hot cocoa, spices, barbecues, and sitting decks. The ranch is designed for year-round use, with insulation for snowy winters and plans for RV parking by next summer. Events can accommodate up to 100 guests, with tents, tables, chairs, and décor packages available.

Shelly and her partner Brent Robertson have poured their hearts into the ranch. "He's the executor, the guy who keeps me on track," she said. "Together, we've built something magical."
