### Idaho City High School Celebrates 30 Years of Wildcat Pride and Community Legacy

**IDAHO CITY** — Thirty years ago, a dream became reality when Idaho City High School opened its doors, giving local students a chance to learn and grow in their own community. On a crisp September evening, that legacy was honored as the school celebrated its 30th anniversary with heartfelt tributes, memories, and a special halftime ceremony recognizing the Class of 1996—the first to graduate from ICHS.

Superintendent and Principal Tricia Kelly reflected on the milestone: “What an honor and privilege to be able to serve and be a part of this amazing community and celebrate 30 years of Idaho City High School! This 30-year milestone honors the hard work of the past and present students, staff, and families who have built traditions, supported one another, and contributed to the success and spirit of our school.”

Sean Nelson, one of the original sixteen graduates, shared his pride: “I had the honor of being one of sixteen students in the Idaho City High School class of '96. Since then, I've spent most of my adult life here

with my wife—also class of '96—raising our children, all ICHS graduates. I've watched this school evolve into the heart of our community.”

Before the high school was built, students endured long commutes to Boise, Horseshoe Bend, or Garden Valley. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner recalled his own experience: “I went to HSB before they had a school here. Took the bus over the hill every day. The school is important not just to the students but the community as a whole.”

Terri Rolfe (Gardner) described the challenges of those early years: “We rose around 4 or 5 in the morning. We had an hour and a half bus ride. Winters were hard. If the buses started, we went to school. The day my brother walked the stage here in Idaho City... we all had tears in our eyes.”

Lisa Kindelberger remembered the four-hour daily commute to attend school in Garden Valley and the sacrifices made to participate in sports: “To be involved meant couch surfing at a friend's for the night. We had a four-wheel drive bus to

navigate the winter roads.”

Rora A. Canody, former Basin 72 Board Chairman, honored the effort behind the school's founding: “It was hard work and determination by the Basin 72 School District team of leaders, and the voters of our school district, that accomplished the building of our Idaho City High School thirty years ago.”

During halftime of the Wildcat homecoming football game, the announcer invited the Class of 1996 onto the field: “Tonight, we pause at halftime not just to cheer for the team on the field, but to honor the roots of Idaho City High School... They were the pioneers of Wildcat tradition... Wildcat Nation, let's give them a round of applause for starting something truly special—thirty years strong, and many more to come!”

The names of the first graduates echoed across the field, a roll call of legacy: Sami Chase Ashbaker, Leah Barcus, Chris Coleman, Jed Cross – RIP, Lexie Davis, Lisa Eklund Kindelberger, Dan Gardner, Rachel Gladhart, Katya Glushkova,



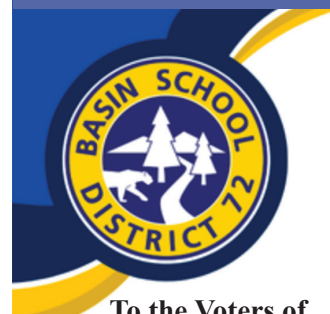

## Levy Information from Basin School District 72



To the Voters of Boise County,

On November 4, 2025, Basin School District voters will decide on a two-year supplemental levy to replace the current levy expiring this year. The proposal is for **\$569,600 annually for 2026–27 and 2027–28**, at a cost of **\$54.09 per \$100,000 of assessed property value**.

Levy funds are vital for programs and positions not fully covered by the state. Idaho's outdated funding system—unchanged since 1994—bases support on Average Daily Attendance, not actual enrollment. This leaves Basin educating more students than the state funds. While Basin has secured **\$736,398 in grants** over the past three years, those dollars are temporary, restricted, and cannot replace stable local support. Federal Secure Rural Schools funding has also ended.

The levy will support:

- School safety and the school resource officer
- Athletics and student activities
- Curriculum and staff pro-

fessional development

- Facility maintenance and technology
- Preschool, kindergarten, school nurse, and student support positions

Key Facts:

• About **79%** of Basin's revenue comes from the State of Idaho; the remaining 21% depends on local taxes, federal funds, and grants.

• Grants are helpful but **short-term and restricted**.

• Federal programs such as Secure Rural Schools have **expired or been reduced**.

• Basin's levy rate is lower than many districts: Buhl \$58, Horseshoe Bend \$68, Castlford \$166, Boise \$306.

Basin has worked hard to secure outside funding, but stable, locally approved levy dollars remain essential to provide safe schools and quality educational opportunities for all students.

# BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

**September 23, 2025**

**Present:** Commissioners Clay Tucker, Lindy Lindstrom, and Bob Callahan.

**Pledge of Allegiance**

**CONSTITUENT INPUT:** A constituent inquired about a zoning issue in Garden Valley and requested more meetings be held around the county by Planning and Zoning.

**MINUTES:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to accept the minutes from September 22<sup>nd</sup>. The motion carried.

**ROAD AND BRIDGE:** A request was made for material for Schafer Creek Bridge, located on Harris Creek. Lumber, Douglas Fir, will need to be milled for decking. The road superintendent thought it was a good deal. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the purchase request for material for Schafer Creek Bridge in the amount of \$10,563.43. The motion carried.

**CLERK:** Mary Prisco explained agreements and invoices, and for cash flow pur-

poses how to deal with invoices for separate fiscal years.

Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve legal services for East Boise County Ambulance District. The motion carried.

**FORESTER:** Contracted work that was done in Two Ravens for fire mitigation was discussed, and Lindstrom motioned to approve the reimbursement amount of \$34,300. The motion carried.

**VEHICLE PURCHASE:** A wildfire coordinator vehicle was discussed for an employee that has driven over 5,000 miles this year for work. Options were discussed. The potential to haul a trailer for search and rescue was also considered.

**SHERIFF:** A jailhouse agreement was discussed for housing inmates. Sheriff Scott Turner offered advice on the agreement with Ada County, "The dollar amount did go up from \$94 dollars a day to \$100 dollars a day, which is to be expected. For the record, it has still been a huge cost savings to

the taxpayers." He said that the cost of a jail would be approximately \$1.8 to \$2.2 million a year to maintain a jail, "verses the \$250,000 a year." Lindstrom motioned to approve the jailhouse agreement with Ada County to go from \$94 to \$100 a day. The motion carried.

**UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO/ 4-H PROGRAM:** Clerk Prisco explained that the same amount as previous years was proposed for sharing the cost of the extension office for the Univ. of Idaho. Lindstrom motioned to approve the cooperative agreement in the amount of \$9,000 and the motion carried.

**EQUIPMENT:** Ordering two CAT pieces of equipment for the road department was discussed, along with their agreements. Lindstrom motioned to approve the sales agreement for the "Reclaimer" and "Backhoe Loader." The motion carried.

**RESOLUTION:** A dissolution process for East Boise County Ambulance District [EBCAD], transferring real

property and assets, was discussed with an external lawyer. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to accept Resolution 2025-54 to authorize executing quick claim deeds and grant authorization of personal property and informed consent for representation. The motion carried.

He then motioned to approve the quick claim deed for 204 Commercial Street and the motion carried. Lindstrom motioned to approve informed consent for the representation agreement. The motion carried.

Lindstrom motioned to approve Resolution 2025-05, an authorization to convey personal property and accept the transference of to East Boise County EMS, transfer of real property and execute informed consent. The motion carried.

Lindstrom motioned to approve the quick claim deed for the Placerville property and the motion carried.

**MINUTES:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from September 16, 2025. The motion carried.

**CLAIMS APPROVAL RE-**

**PORT:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the claims approval report in the amount of \$292,507.24. The motion carried.

**CATERING PERMIT:** A motion was said to approve a catering permit and the motion carried.

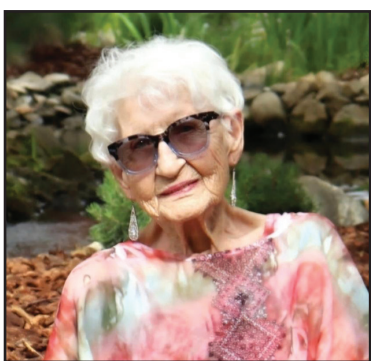
**DEMAND WARRANT:** The cost of three sanders for the road department was briefly discussed. Lindstrom motioned to approve payment to the Idaho Transportation Department in the amount of \$60,000. The motion carried.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to go into a closed session to discuss personnel issues. [Time 11:06 am to 12:27 am] Coming back into session, Chairman Tucker said there were no actions required.

**FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:** Discussed future agenda items, upcoming election, and moving the November 11<sup>th</sup> meeting to the 10<sup>th</sup>.

Chairman Tucker recessed the meeting until Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, or earlier, if needed. [Time 12:40 pm]

Margaret Alice Odle passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by family and her faithful dog Bear, who never left her side, on Sunday, September 21st. She was born on June 1st, 1929, in Grandview, Idaho, to John and Mary Shaffer. The youngest of five sisters, Margaret carried forward the strength, wit, and heart of the women who came before her. She married the love of her life, Lyle Irvin Odle, on August 19, 1951, beginning a great love story that would span the course of 62 years.

Margaret was known for her sass, spunk, beauty, style, and heart. She was a proud member of the Rebekah Lodge for over 50 years, where she made countless lifelong friends and was best known for painting unique aprons for Rebekah Assembly presidents—each one crafted with love and intention. Even in her final days, she was planning her next

personalized design and lining up a workforce to finish this last work of service and art. She also worked as a manager for One Hour Martinizing, retiring after more than 20 years of service.

A talented seamstress and baker, Margaret made shirts for her children to wear in riding clubs and parades and lovingly sewed dresses for her granddaughter's choir performances. She was famous for her beautiful rose garden lining the fence of her home, her baking, and her incredible holiday dishes.

Margaret's home was filled with warmth, laughter, and love. Everyone who entered her door was considered family, including the many unique pets her children brought home over the years—like a skunk, magpie, rubber boa (that scared most of the family), and even an alligator. She was an avid pinocle player, a faithful believer in Jesus, an enthusiastic Boise State Broncos fan, and—most importantly—a woman who always made those around her feel seen, accepted, and deeply loved.

In her final weeks, while in rehabilitation, staff and fellow residents affectionately called her "The Queen Bee," a title that perfectly captured her radiant spirit and signature sense of style. She was always beautifully dressed and carried herself with grace, strength, and poise.

Margaret was the heart of five living generations and is survived

by her children: John Odle, Linda Sirani (Joe), and Steve Odle; grandchildren: Melanie Dossett (Eric), Chris McVey (Amber), Tim Odle (Joanna), and Misti Odle; great-grandchildren: Caitlin Kantola (James), Serenity, Sebastian, Matilda, Thane, and Emmy McVey; Samantha, Isabella, Rachael, and Lilly Odle; Trynyty Scarpa; and great-great-grandchildren: Daniel, Alora, and Benjamin Kantola; step-grandchildren: Leslie (Chris) and Chris Sirani (Jen); step-great-grandchildren: Sabrina (Humberto), Trevor, Douglas (Beth), Karsen, Chris, Kathryn, and Michael; and step-great-great-grandchildren: Avery, Teresa, and Rayna.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Lyle I. Odle; her great-grandson, Cody Dossett; and former son-in-law, Jack McVey, who was like a son to her.

Margaret's family will continue her legacy of love, laughter, and togetherness. She will be forever missed.

## SH-21 to close for two days north of Grandjean for culvert installation



STANLEY —The Idaho Transportation Department will close State Highway 21 north of Grandjean Tuesday at 7 a.m. for two days to complete emergency repairs caused by the August 2025 landslide. The closure will last for two days, with the roadway scheduled to reopen by 6 p.m. Oct. 8.

Mud from the recent landslide plugged an existing culvert, diverting Canyon Creek to the east side of the highway. The creek is currently flowing along the shoulder and eroding the road. To protect the highway and restore the creek to its natural channel, crews will install a new six-foot culvert across both

lanes. "This emergency repair is absolutely vital," Operations Engineer Michael Garz said. "Closing the highway for two days allows crews to complete the culvert installation safely and quickly, minimizing long-term impacts and preventing a potential longer closure later."

The new culvert will also handle potential overflow during future high-water events, which are likely due to burn scars from the Wapiti Fire.

## Idaho City High School STEAM Students Launch First Weather Balloon, Track Global Journey

“This project has brought science to life for my students,” said Ms. Kulick. “They’re learning about jet streams, global wind patterns, and radio frequencies while tracking our balloon’s journey. It’s currently over Kazakhstan, heading toward the Black Sea.”

Using amateur radio frequencies and the 10-meter bandwidth, students are monitoring the balloon’s location daily, applying meteorological concepts to predict its path. The payload, kept under the 2-pound limit for amateur radio operators, includes a solar panel, antenna, and GPS device.

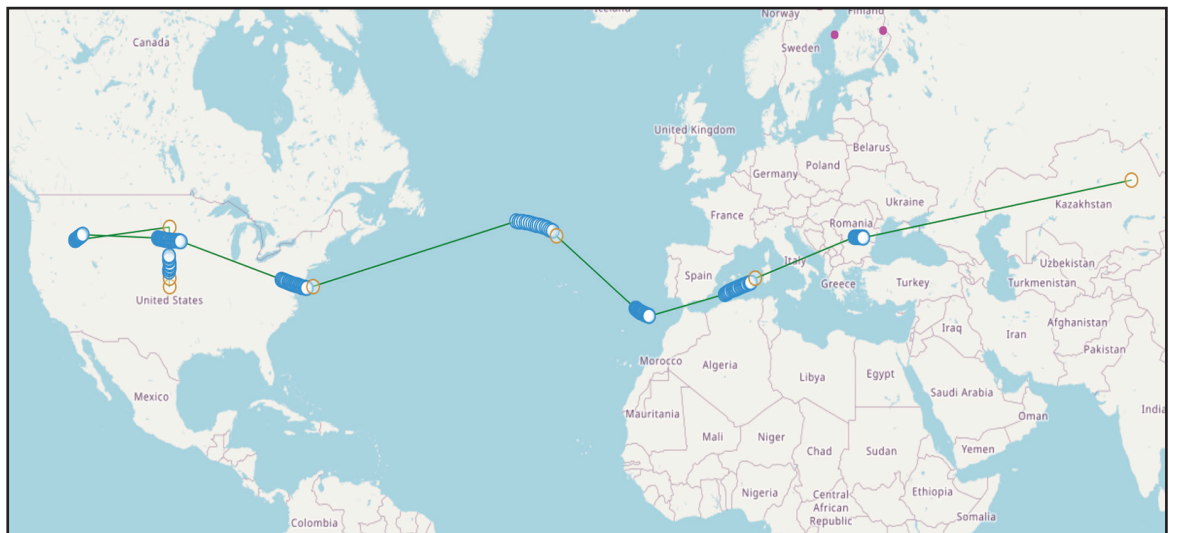
Kulick praised Blout and Doty for their dedication: “They’ve donated time, materials, and expertise to make science relevant and exciting. Watching my students solder, calculate lift, and track our balloon has been a blast.”

The school community is hopeful the balloon will eventually return home. Until then, students continue to learn from its journey—one data point at a time.

**IDAHO CITY** — On September 16, 2025, Idaho City High School’s STEAM students (grades 9–12) successfully launched their first weather balloon from the school’s football field, marking a milestone in hands-on science education.

Under the guidance of local volunteers Robert Blout and Mike Doty, students assembled, filled, and released the balloon,

which is now transmitting data as it floats across the globe. The project was initiated when Blout, a ham radio enthusiast and grandfather, reached out to science educator Natalie Kulick last year to explore student involvement. Doty, a NASA-certified soldering expert, joined the effort, helping students build and solder the GPS and communication hardware.

**02-0108-2501, Rules Governing Grizzly Bear and Wolf Depredation.** New Chapter governs distribution from the Depredation of Livestock and Prevention Fund to compensate livestock owners that have experienced depredation of livestock by grizzly bear and/or wolves.

**02-0205-2501, Rules Governing Stone Fruit Grades.** Zero-Based Regulation (ZBR) Chapter Rewrite specifies general requirements for the inspection and grading of plums, prunes, sweet cherries, and apricots in the state of Idaho.

**02-0207-2501, Rules Governing Bulk Permits and Retail Sale of Potatoes.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs the application for a permit to ship bulk potatoes, permit fees, and marketing order requirements and specifies the inspection, grading, marking, and retail sales of potatoes in the state.

**02-0214-2501, Rules for Weights and Measures.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite regulates the checking, testing, and examination of weighing and measuring devices, packages, and labels for consumer, non-consumer, and commercial applications to ensure the accuracy of consumers' commodities.

**02-0303-2501, Rules Governing Pesticide and Chemigation Use and Application.** Proposed changes consider the option of a five-year license term, separating new license categories for potato cellar and wood preservation licenses, adding a new category for applicators using aerial unmanned drones, and lengthening the sunset provisions on commercial apprentices.

**02-0420-2501, Rules Governing Brucellosis.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs prevention, surveillance, diagnosis, control, management, and eradication of brucellosis in the state to minimize market restrictions on Idaho cattle.

**02-0424-2501, Rules Governing Tuberculosis.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite oversees procedures for the prevention, surveillance, control, management, and eradication of tuberculosis in all cattle, bison, domestic cervidae, goats, and other susceptible animals in

the state of Idaho.

**02-0426-2501, Rules Governing the Public Exchange of Livestock.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite regulates the record keeping of livestock dealers and facilities, and the record keeping, identification, quarantine, and movement of livestock through buying stations, trader lots, and livestock markets.

**02-0601-2501, Rules Governing the Production and Distribution of Seed.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs the sale or distribution of seed in Idaho, including restrictions to protect rapeseed and bluegrass, and also establish service testing fees for purity, germination, tetrazolium, and special tests.

**02-0602-2501, Rules Governing Registrations and Licenses.** Rulemaking makes annual updates to Incorporated by Reference documents that include refinements to definitions, technical terms, and other standards vital for meeting both statutory and national cooperation product regulation.

**02-0606-2501, Rules Governing the Planting of Beans.** Proposed change clarifies the seed imported to Idaho to be planted to produce edible beans.

**02-0633-2501, Organic Food Products Rules.** Changes update the National Organic Program Regulations document Incorporated by Reference and amend the application period for organic certification to more align with crop production years which will assist with certification management.

**02-0701-2501, Rules of the Idaho Hop Growers' Commission.** ZBR Chapter Repeal recommended due to prescriptive nature of authorizing statute.

**08-0202-2501, Rules Governing Uniformity.** Proposed changes to the Code of Ethics for Idaho Professional Educators aim to reduce unethical interactions by: limiting educator/student communications to district approved devices and platforms; prohibiting use of a district device or network to engage in any sexually explicit activity; and by restricting co-mingling public funds with any personal account.

**08-0203-2501, Rules Governing Thoroughness.** Proposed change updates the Special Education Manual Incorporated by Reference to clarify: specific learning disability (SLD) eligibility requirements; guidance related to charter school, private school, and home-school students; and guidance related to graduation requirements and discipline.

**08-0203-2502, Rules Governing Thoroughness.** Proposed amendments update the Social Studies K-12 content standards Incorporated by Reference as a result of prior rule rejection via legislative action and per the request of the legislature.

**08-0205-2501, Rules Governing Pay for Success Contracting.** ZBR Chapter Repeal de-

termined by nonutilization of rule provisions by agency.

**13-0103-2501, Public Use of Lands Owned or Controlled by the Department of Fish and Game.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs use of lands owned or controlled by the Department by adding clarifying language around prohibited activities; adding a definition for 'camping' and modifying the 'watercraft' definition for consistency; and adding language that provides the agency more flexibility in posting camping stay limits.

**13-0104-2401, Rules Governing Licensing.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs licensing and, after evaluation, moves out relevant content that specifically addresses big game to 13.01.08 and moves in content that addresses general licensing topics from 13.01.08 to help streamline both chapters. Additional changes address multiple Landowner Programs and Hunts and provide more opportunities for Hells Canyon hunters.

**13-0108-2401, Rules Governing Taking of Big Game Animals.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite governs the taking of big game animals and, after evaluation, moves in relevant content that specifically addresses big game from 13.01.04 and moves out content that addresses general licensing topics to 13.01.04 to help streamline both chapters.

**13-0116-2401, Trapping of Wildlife and Taking of Furbearing Animals.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite regulates the trapping of wildlife and taking of furbearing animals and: clarifies definition for 'bait'; increases accidental take reimbursement to \$25 for bobcat, otter, or fisher; allows for discretion to authorize use of certain snow-covered routes; and refines restrictions and clarifications on trapping.

**13-0117-2401, Rules Governing Use of Bait for Hunting Big Game Animals.** ZBR Chapter Repeal moves vital provisions to dkt. 13-0108-2401.

**13-0119-2501, Rules for Selecting, Operating, Discontinuing, and Suspending Vendors.** ZBR Chapter Rewrite establishes standards for license vendors and related administration and: removes vendor classifications to simplify the process; adds a 'community benefit' component allowing for applicants to qualify; adds structured language for vendor application disqualification or contract cancellations; removes eligibility for out-of-state applicants; and allows vendors

to collect a credit card fee.
