Community Gathers for Another Memorable "Generations in the Mountains" Event

GARDEN VALLEY -- Nearly fifty community members filled the Garden Valley Library for the latest installment of Generations in the Mountains, a quarterly local-history series hosted by the Garden Valley Historical Society. The evening's featured speaker was longtime resident and former Elk Springs Ranch owner, Clint Evans, whose deep knowledge of the area's past made for an engaging and memorable program.

Evans guided the audience through the storied history of the Elk Springs Ranch, sharing firsthand insights and anecdotes gathered over decades of living and working in Garden Valley. His presentation blended historical facts with vivid storytelling, giving listeners a unique glimpse into the evolution of one of the valley's most

recognizable properties.

One highlight of the evening was Evans's account of Packer John, a colorful and influential figure in Idaho's early frontier history. Evans captivated the audience with tales of Packer John's landmark cabin, his fascinating life, and the circumstances surrounding his untimely death. He also shared the story behind the intricately carved George Washington monument, created by sculptor Charles Ostner, which now resides in the Idaho State Capitol. These stories, along with several other lesser-known local history tidbits, sparked lively conversation and curiosity among attendees.

The program concluded with a collaborative look at the history of local churches, presented by parishioners from congregations throughout the valley. Each representative offered a brief reflection on their church's beginnings and its role in the community, adding a heartfelt and personal touch to the evening.

Attendees described the night as both fun and educational, praising the opportunity to learn more about the people, places, and stories that shaped Garden Valley.

The Garden Valley Historical Society hosts the Generations in the Mountains series four times a year. Community members are encouraged to watch for upcoming dates and join in for more evenings of storytelling and celebration of the valley's heritage.

\$39,000 in Forever Idaho Grants Fuel Local Education and History Projects

BOISE COUNTY —

The Idaho Community Foundation (ICF) has awarded \$182,560 in Forever Idaho grants to 28 nonprofit organizations across Southwest Idaho—excluding Ada County—with \$39,000 directed to Boise County to support vital community initiatives.

Local recipients include:

- Basin School District No. 72 – \$25,000
- Horseshoe Bend School District #73 – \$8,000
- Idaho City Historical Foundation, Inc. – \$6,000

These flexible grants empower organizations to address pressing needs such as food assistance, mental health services, youth education, library access, and community development.

"The Forever Idaho program is a reflection of our trust in local organizations to lead," said Frances Nagashima, chair of the Southwest Regional Council. "These are people and groups who are already doing the work, and this funding gives them the support and flexibility to keep going."

Kent Fogg, ICF Director of Impact, added, "Forever Idaho grants are designed with flexibility in mind because we trust our nonprofit partners to know what their communities need most—and to put these funds to work in ways that create the biggest impact."

Local Impact Highlights

Basin Elementary Principal Jamie Pilkerton shared that the grant will sustain the

district's tuition-free preschool program for all 4-year-olds, along with family workshops and early learning resources.

"These initiatives promote healthy development, early academic readiness, and long-term success through strong collaboration with families," Pilkerton said. "We're deeply grateful for ICF's investment in our children and our future."

Idaho City Historical Foundation President Barbara McClain said the grant will fund interpretive signage for a new Logging Display in the park adjacent to the Territorial Penitentiary.

"The display will tell the story of logging in the Boise Basin—how timber supported mining, heating, steam power, and construction," McClain explained. The project began this fall with the placement of a 17'11" log at the center of the park. Community members with stories or photos of early logging are encouraged to contact ICHF at 208-850-1014.

Dennis Chesnut, Superintendent and grades 6–12 Principal of Horseshoe Bend School District, expressed appreciation for the grant, which will support the district's Community Schools efforts.

The Forever Idaho program, funded by generous donors, ensures that resources remain responsive to evolving needs. Each region's grant cycle is guided by local councils to ensure relevance and impact.

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Lindy Lindstrom, and Bob Callahan.

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None.

MEETING MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to accept the minutes from October 28th and November 3rd. The motions carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE: A seasonal hire was discussed, and a motion was made for temporary work to be done with the Road and Bridge Department. The motion carried.

A request to purchase a snowblade was made for one of the graders. The Boise County Road and Bridge Superintendent said that they are down to five good snowblades and they need six. He found a good blade at a competitive price, and the amount to cover the cost was in the budget. Lindstrom motioned to approve the purchase of a snowblade in the amount of \$18,100.

JUVENILE JUSTICE REPORT: Amanda Leader spoke about the two forms that are submitted to the state of Idaho. This was a statistical report, and she reviewed these with the board. Leader stated, "This year over prior years, we had very few diversion cases, about half as many, and we've had twice as many probation cases." Lindstrom motioned to approve the county juvenile justice report.

CLAIMS REPORT: After no discussion, Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the claims approval report in the amount of \$153,969.19 and the motion carried.

ELECTION: Clerk Mary Prisco presented the results for the election that occurred in the prior week. She stated, "The states and the counties, as the election's administrators, did adopt new election night software reporting for this November election. So, it was the first time using that software. It actually worked out really well.

There were a few bumps, but actually, it's better than what we had before, which was an application within the State's Voter Registration system. The new software is Advanced Voting." There was an issue that they are working on with the State's Controller's Office, "but the election went pretty well." There was one change to the City of Idaho City that was reported on Tuesday night.

Clerk Prisco said an email had been received regarding an issue, and she stated for the record, "The Express Votes, which is the machine that they vote on, are *not* connected to the internet, nor is the tabulator which counts the votes." She continued, "It is the duty of the election day workers, at any of our precincts, the person assigned to assist with the voting, the actual voter using the Express Vote machine, it is their responsibility to make sure that they – that the first items that are entered in the machine, prior to voting, is correct for that individual's districts that they're eligible to vote for. I think there was some commentary in that email about *that*, that just tells us that the election day workers are doing exactly what they're supposed to do."

Clerk Prisco added that there had been a "pretty high voter turnout in Garden Valley, which I would say, based on my experience, whenever we have a higher voter turnout, there tends to be more scuttlebutt and

people expressing their concerns." There were two Garden Valley voter questions, one for the school and the other for the fire district. Chairman Tucker indicated, "And it was a big deal in Garden Valley."

Lindstrom motioned to accept the November General Election canvas and abstract. The motion carried.

AIR ST. LUKE'S: A demand warrant for each coverage renewal for all the 79 county full time employees with Air St. Luke's was discussed. Lindstrom motioned to approve the demand warrant for \$4,345. The motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to enter a closed session to discuss pending litigation. [Time 9:16 am to 9:36 am] No action was required.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to go back into a closed session to discuss acquiring real property. [Time 9:36 am to 9:51 am] Commissioner Tucker said that there was no action required.

SOFTWARE: Grant writing software was discussed and there were comments that it would be a very useful search tool for the county's needs, including search and rescue efforts, etc. The topic of acquiring the software will be discussed at the next meeting.

Recessed until Tuesday, November 18th.

Be aware of these common scams. Idaho Power NEVER:

- Demands immediate pay-

ment over the phone

- Requires a payment for a defective meter
- Asks for same-day payment via pre-paid cards, such as the Green Dot MoneyPak
- Accepts pre-paid cards, like Visa or Green Dot
- Asks customers to pay using Bitcoin or QR codes

Although the average Idaho Power customer is without power for fewer than four hours per year, heavy snow on lines or strong winds can cause longer outages. As the weather gets colder, Idaho Power wants to ensure you're prepared by following these tips:

- Plan for any unique medical needs, such as refrigerated medication or life-support systems.
- Keep electric space heaters

away from flammable materials.

Rare Aurora Lights Up Idaho Skies During G5 Storms



GARDEN VALLEY — Residents of Garden Valley were treated to a breathtaking and rare display of the Aurora Borealis last week, thanks to powerful G5 geomagnetic storms on Tuesday, November 11 and Wednesday, November 12.

Local photographer Linda Ruppel of the *Idaho World* captured the phenomenon, noting that the KP9 rating was exceptionally rare for the area. On Tuesday night, the aurora was visible to the naked eye with a full 360-degree view, while Wednesday's display required cameras or phones with night capabilities, appearing mainly in the northern and northeastern skies.

Ruppel, who often photographs auroras at KP6 or KP7 ratings, called this week's event "a real treat," spending over four hours Tuesday and two and a half hours Wednesday documenting the spectacle.

"I have over 600 photos to get through," she said, and the above photo made the cut.

Aurora Color Guide

- Red — Above 150 miles high (due to low oxygen levels)
- Green — Up to 150 miles high (high concentrations of oxygen)
- Purple — Above 60 miles high (high concentrations of nitrogen)

The dazzling colors and sweeping views reminded residents of the rare beauty that nature can bring to Idaho's night skies.

Lowman History – Porter Bros. Uranium Mining 1955-1960, Part 1

Red Mountain Roadless Area Mining – Bear Valley to Lowman, Idaho

LOWMAN -- The Porter Brothers Corporation operated the Lowman Mill from 1955-1960. The mill recovered rare-earth elements from sands excavated from the Bear Valley site located north of the mill. The sands were processed using a mechanical-separation process instead of chemical separation. Approximately 200,000 tons of concentrates were produced. The waste product consisted of sand containing uranium, radium, and thorium. The mill was closed in 1960, and the site was abandoned. The sand piles remained at the abandoned site (current location of the Lowman Merc and residential properties) until 1991, exposing residents to toxic contamination.

Road to the right, before the bridge, leads to the tailing's disposal site the Porter Brothers mining used for milling operations of uranium and other rare earth metals. The current day location is the Lowman Merc and residential properties area.
